**Accessibility:** Wheelchair accessible accommodations will be provided upon request. All meeting rooms at UNLV are wheelchair accessible.



# In Solidarity With...

On Saturday evening, August 6, we will gather at the Nevada Test Site for storytelling, an Eth-Noh-Tec performance, followed by a healing ceremony and optional civil disobedience. Our event and public witness at the Test Site is planned in solidarity with actions throughout the world, and U.S.-coordinated actions will occur at the Nevada Test Site, Livermore Nuclear Weapons Lab, Los Alamos Nuclear Weapons Lab, and the Y-12 Nuclear Faeility in Oak Ridge, TN.

The characters inside the sunflower watermark are the Japanese numbers for 60, which is an important birthday in Japanese culture. The sunflower is also the international symbol for nuclear abolition. This year, we use this logo to remember the devastation wrought on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

### **Nonviolent Communication (NVC)**

Nonviolent Communication and Social Change helps people connect compassionately with themselves and with one another. NVC and Social Change seeks to contribute to a peaceful and sustainable future by modeling and teaching connection, transparency, and compassion as the foundation of social change work. This workshop will be led by Miki Kashtan, a certified trainer with the Center for Nonviolent Communication, as well as project coordinator for NVC and Social Change.

#### Pace e Bene Nonviolence Service

Pace e Bene is convinced that one of the solutions to the crisis of violence lies in furnishing transformation of violence and conflict. Pace e Bene works to develop within ourselves and to share with others the understanding of active nonviolence. Pace e Bene has introduced nonviolence to more than 8,000 people, and its *From Violence to Wholeness Program* offers a set of tools to respond to the growing crisis of violence. Workshop presenters will include Ken Butigan, Laura Slattery and Ken Preston-Pile.

#### Fellowship of Reconciliation

The Fellowship of Reconciliation's nonviolence training, Creating a Culture of Peace - Nonviolence Training for Personal and Social Change, prepares new facilitators to offer a spiritual formation program in communities and to empower others for personal and social change. It grounds participants in the power of active nonviolence, exposes them to facilitation skills and an education methodology, and allows time to practice leadership and to receive feedback.
